

TUESDAY, February 5th, 1833.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday and Saturday were read.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the conveyance of certain real estate therein mentioned, rejected by the Senate on Friday, was returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Hughlett from the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, to which was referred the resolution in favor of James Watts, of Dorchester county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr Morris from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise the trustees of Saint Patrick's Church, in the city of Baltimore, to hold certain property, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

Mr. Claude from the committee, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Annapolis Savings Fund, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, and passed.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following resolutions:

A resolution allowing the register of the land office, free access to the state library, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Emory, Page and Dennis.

A resolution in favor of Jonathan Keishnea and James P. Bayless, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on finance.

A resolution in favor of Alexander Shafer, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A resolution authorising the Governor to issue a commission to the Honorable Joseph Kent, as a senator in the congress of the United States, which was read the first, and by special order the second and third time, assented to, and returned to the House of Delegates.
