

WEDNESDAY, February 6th, 1833.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Forrest, (president,) who was prevented by indisposition, from taking the chair to-day.

On motion of Mr. Montgomery, the Senate proceeded to elect a president *pro tem*, when Mr. Hughlett was elected. He accordingly took the chair.

Mr. Pigman appeared in the Senate Chamber, and took his seat.

The proceedings of yesterday were read.
