

stockholders by any rule or by-law, to restrict or limit the number of weekly depositors, who may desire to deposit or become members of said corporation, provided, the amount paid by each depositor, be not less than the sum of one dollar per week, and that they in all things comply with the provisions of this act, and the rules and by-laws which may from time to time be adopted.

Section 5. *And be it enacted,* That the regular weekly deposits of any member of said corporation shall in no case exceed the sum of four dollars per week, and that the whole amount of such deposits shall in no instance exceed the sum of two thousand dollars.

On motion of Mr. Montgomery, the order adopted by the Senate on yesterday, requesting the president to forward a letter, by mail, to John C. Groome, Esq. informing him of his election as senator, was reconsidered, and

On Motion of Mr. Mayer, it was amended by striking out the words by mail, and inserting the words by express.

It was then read and adopted.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the report and resolution relative to the states' subscription, to a work proposed to be published on the testamentary of Maryland, by the honorable Judge Dorsey, were read the second time by special order, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
