

under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to be assented to with the following amendments, which were read and assented to:

1. Strike out the following words in the 6th line of the resolution, "and thirty perches."

2. Add the following proviso at the end of the resolution:

"Provided, that the said register shall be first satisfied that all the auction money and other dues have been paid prior to the issuing of said patent or patents."

The resolution was then read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Sappington, the bill entitled, an act to authorize the governor and council to appoint directors of the banks therein mentioned, was read the third time by special order and passed.

The bill entitled a supplement to the act entitled, An act to amend and reduce into one system the laws to direct deposits, was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading. It was accordingly engrossed and on motion of Mr. Dennis, read the third time by special order, and passed.

Mr. Dennis, from the committee on judicial proceedings to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to repeal an act to abolish imprisonment for debt on certain judgments rendered by Justices of the Peace, passed at December session 1830, chapter 135, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and a majority of said committee had instructed him to report favorably thereon. It was read the second time, and on motion of Mr. Dennis it was made the order of the day for Friday the 15th day of February present.

The bill entitled, An act relating to the duties of the commissioners of Anne-Arundel County, was read the third time and passed.

Mr. Hagan, from the committee on insolvency, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act for the relief of Thomas Clarke of Anne-Arundel County, reported favorably thereon. It was read the second, and by special order, the third time, and passed.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10 o'clock.
