FRIDAY, February 8th, 1833.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, An act to authorise the Governor and Council to appoint Directors of the Banks therein mentioned, and the bill entitled a supplement to the act entitled, an act to amend and reduce into one system the Laws to direct Descents, severally passed by the senate on yesterday, were sent, and the bill entitled a supplement to an act entitled, An act to provide for the public printing of the State, passed December session 1831, chapter 303, passed with sundry amendments on yesterday, and the bill entitled, an act for the relicf of Thomas S. Clarke of Anne-Arundel County, and the bill entitled, an act relating to the duties of the commissioners of Anne-Arundel County, also severally passed by the senate on yesterday, were returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Morris presented the petition of A. Worthington and others, praying an act to incorporate a company to turn-pike a part of the Bell-Air road, which was read and referred to the committee on Internal Improvement.

The bill entitled, An act for the benefit of the Representatives of William Chilton, late of Caroline County, deceased, was read the third time, and the question was put, "Shall the bill pass?" It was determined in the negative, and it was returned to the House of Delegates.

The bill entitled, an act for the sale of the real estate therein mentioned was read the third time, and on motion of Mr. Dennis it was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of Washington County to build a Stone Bridge across Antietam Creek on the road from Funkstown to Williamsport, where the old wooden bridge now stands, was read the third time, passed, and returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Page the bill entitled, an act for the incorporation of the Grand Lodge of the State of Maryland of the order of Independent Odd Fellows; together with the amendments heretotore adopted, was taken up for consideration, and w hilst progressing in the third reading,
