On motion of Mr. Sappington it was ordered to lie on the table.

The senate adjourned until Monday morning 10 o'clock.

MONDAY February 11th, 1833.

The senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday.

Mr. Forrest, (President) appeared in the senate chamber and resumed the chair.
