

WEDNESDAY, February 13th, 1833.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution in favor of John Hutchinson, of Dorchester county, the resolution requiring the treasurer of the Western Shore to pay to his excellency, the Governor, the sum of money therein mentioned, and the resolution in favor of Jonathan Kershner, of Hagerstown, and James P. Bayless of Baltimore City, severally assented to, by the Senate on yesterday, and the bill entitled, an act to explain an act of assembly, passed at December session, 1831, chapter 323, entitled an act relating to free negroes and slaves, passed by the Senate on yesterday, were returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Pigman from the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings, to which was referred the resolution in favor of Alexander Robertson, of Allegany county, reported that the committee had had said resolution under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to be assented to, with the following amendment, which was read and assented to: Strike out the words, "the first day of February, 1833," and insert the words "the tenth day of March, 1833."

The resolution was then read the second time.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Frederick and Woodsborough Turnpike Road Company, was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Morris from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act relating to Parkin street, in the City of Baltimore, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Wootton from the committee, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to provide for the completion of the records in the office of the register of wills of Prince Georges county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

Mr. Dennis from the committee, to which was referred the resolution in favor of James Harrison, (of Wil-
