

THURSDAY, February 14th, 1833.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution in favor of James Harrison, (of William) rejected by the Senate on yesterday, and the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Alfred Lee, of Ohio, now in the custody of the sheriff, of Montgomery county, passed by the Senate on yesterday, were returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Sappington, leave was granted to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act to regulate proceedings against corporations.

Ordered, that Messrs. Sappington, Page and Dennis be a committee to prepare and report the same.

On motion of Mr. Pigman the resolution in favor of Alexander Robertson, of Allegany county, was read the third time by special order, assented to and returned to the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following resolutions:

A resolution in favor of John Burbridge, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings.

A resolution requiring the register of the land office, to record certain papers, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings.

A resolution relative to a state bank, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

A resolution in favor of Adam Hoops, of the state of New-York, a resolution in favor of Stephen Fennell, of the state of Ohio, and a resolution in favor of Harriet Williams, which were severally read the first time, and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also the following bills:

A bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act of December session, 1827, chapter 117, entitled, an act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries, and others, which was read the
