Page, Montgomery and Osborn.

And returned the following bills, which originated in the Senate, severally endorsed, "will pass."

A bill entitled an act to authorise certain improvements in the eastern part of the City of Baltimore.

And a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Charles

Barr, of the City of Baltimore.

Mr. Morris from the committee, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to confirm an act passed at December session, 1831, chapter 232, altering and amending the constitution of this state, so far as relates to election districts in Baltimore county, reported favorably thereon.
