

On motion of Mr. Page, Mr. Wootton was substituted in the place of Mr. Chapman, on the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to repeal an act, to prohibit the use of gill nets, in the Potomac and Patuxent rivers, during the period therein mentioned.

Mr. Page from the committee on judicial proceedings to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to make valid and effective in certain cases, sheriffs' bonds in, and for Allegany county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10 o'clock.

FRIDAY, February 15th, 1833.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act relating to private wharves, docks, and the like, in the City of Baltimore, passed by the Senate on yesterday, was returned to the House of Delegates.

The Senate proceeded to the consideration of the order of the day, being the bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act to abolish imprisonment for debt on certain judgments rendered by justices of the peace, passed at December session, 1830, chapter 155, when

On motion of Mr. Sappington, the consideration of said bill was further postponed, and it was made the order of the day, for to-morrow, (Saturday) the 16th inst.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following resolutions:

A resolution relative to opening the navigation through the sounds, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

A resolution authorising the state librarian to dispose of certain copies of the debates and proceedings of the Virginia State Convention of 1829, 1830, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on the library.
