alley in the town of Hager's-town, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Pigman from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of Washington county, to levy upon the assessable property of said county, a sum or sums of money in case of epidemics, reported favorably thereon. It was read the second time.

Mr. Morris from the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, to which was referred a resolution in favor of Elizabeth Downing, widow of Butler Downing, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time and assented to.

On motion of Mr. Pigman, the bill entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of Washington county to levy on the assessable property of said county, a sum or sums of money in case of epidemics, was read the third time by special order and passed.

On motion of Mr. Morris, the bill entitled, an act to confirm an act passed at December session 1831, ch 232, altering and amending the constitution of this state, so far as relates to election districts in Baltimore county was read the third time and passed.

Mr. Sappington from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an acti to authorise the levy court of Frederick county to allow additional compensation to John P. Schuyler, and for other purposes, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments;

Which were read and assented to:

In the 4th line of the 3d section strike out the word "fifty" and insert the words "one hundred." In the same line of the same section strike out the word "twenty" and insert the word "forty;" and in the 5th line of the same section strike out the word "ten" and insert the word "five."

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time and passed.
