The resolution in favor of the warden of Baltimore county jail, was read the third time and assented to.

Mr. Dennis from the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings to which was referred the resolution requiring the register of the land office to record certain papers, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time and assented to.

Mr. Pigman from the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings to which was referred the resolution in favor of John Burbridge, reported favorably thereon. It was read the second time.

Mr. Morris from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to the act to provide for the distribution of that part of the school fund which is appropriated to Baltimore county, passed at December session 1828, ch. 185, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment which was read and assented to:

At the end of the bill add the following section:

"And be it enacted, That if the election districts in said county shall from time to time exceed the number recognised in this act, and also the act to which it is a supplement, then the several provisions therein contained are hereby extended to apply to such additional district or districts in the same manner and for every beneficial purpose as they now are intended to apply to the several districts therein referred to."
