

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Morris, the bill entitled, an act to divorce Sarah Barrett, from her husband Patrick Barrett, of Baltimore county, was read the third time as proposed to be amended, and the question was put, "shall the bill pass?" The yeas and nays were asked for, and on taken them, they appeared as follows:

A bill entitled, an act for the relief of Joseph Wood, former sheriff of Calvert county, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

Mr. Emory from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to divorce Sarah Gilmore of the City of Baltimore, from her husband David S. Barnum, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Morris, leave was granted to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act to incorporate the Toulon Company.

Ordered, that Messrs. Morris, Page and Dennis, be a committee to prepare and report the same.
