

The bill entitled, an act to divorce Eliza Selby of Baltimore city, from her husband James Selby *a mensa et thoro*, passed by the senate on Saturday was returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Sappington from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise the governor and council to appoint one justice of the levy court for each election district in Frederick county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Montgomery from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Cecil county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments, which were read and assented to:

Strike out all after the word "that" in the 1st line of the 1st section, to the word "be" in the 2nd line, and insert the names "Levi H. Evans, John S. Moffitt, Henry D. Miller, William Mackey, Joseph Harlan."

In the 5th line 5th section, strike out the word "two," and insert the word "three."

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Montgomery from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a further supplement to an act empowering and directing the commissioners of Cecil county to build two fire proof offices for the use of the clerks and register of wills for the safe keeping of the records appertaining to their respective offices, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Sappington from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to "an act entitled, an act relating to people of color in this state; which was read the first time.

Mr. Mayer presented the petition of George F. R. Waesche and others, praying an act to authorise the opening of Vine street in Baltimore;
