A bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate the sales of real estate by the collectors of tax in the several Counties of this State, passed at December session 1831, chapter 99, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act to alter and change the name of Samuel Raitt Creighton, of Dorchester County, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Dennis, Morris and Montgomery.

A bill entitled, an act authorising the commissioners of Harford County to levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Montgomery, Dennis and Sappington.

The bill entitled, an act to explain an act entitled, an act to authorise Cornelia A. Howard, guardian of John E. Howard of the City of Baltimore to lease certain property therein mentioned, was read the third time and passed.

Mr. Morris from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to repeal an act passed at December session 1827, chapter 83, reported favorably thereon. It was read the second, and by special order the third time, and passed.

Mr. Morris from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Toulon company, which was read the first time.

Mr. Mayer presented the petition of Lewis W. H. Giese praying that a part of Schroeder Street in Baltimore be not allowed to be opened, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs Mayer, Morris and Wootton.

The bill, entitled, an act to repeal in part an act entitled, An act to prohibit the use of Gill Nets in the Potomac and Patuxent rivers during the period therein mentioned, was read the third time, and the question put, "Shall the bill pass?" The yeas and nays were asked for, and on taking them they appeared as follows:
