

And returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act vesting certain powers in the President of the United States, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment."

The said amendment was read and adopted, and was as follows:

Strike out all after the word "made" in the last line of the 1st section and insert "whenever the same respectively be necessary along the line of said road."
