the following amendment, which was read and assented to:

At the end of the bill add,

And be it enacted, that the concerns of said company shall be at all times subject to the inspection of the treasurer of the Western Shore, or such other officer of the State as may be selected for that purpose from time to time by either branch of the Legislature,"

The bill was then read the second time.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act to provide for the distribution of that part of the school fund which is appropriated to Baltimore County, passed at December session 1828, chapter 185, was read the third time as proposed to be amended, passed, and returned to the house of delegates:

Mr. Dennis from the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Daniel Orrell and others, of Caroline County, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments, which were read and assented to:

"Strike out all of the 1st section after the word "if" in the 9th line, and in lieu thereof insert the following clause:

"The property had all descended from the last remaining brother."

The bill was then read the second, and by special order, the third time, and passed.

Mr. Dennis from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to alter and change the name of Samuel Raitt Creighton of Dorchester County, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment, which was read and assented to:

Strike out the whole of the bill after the enacting clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:

"That the name of Samuel Raitt Creighton of Dorchester County, be, and the same is hereby altered and changed to Samuel Raitt Keene; and it shall and may be lawful for the said Samuel Raitt Creighton at all times hereafter to be called and known by, and hold and use the name of Samuel Raitt Keene to purchase, sell, convey or devise, to see and be saed, in any Court of Law or equity:
