On motion of Mr. Dennis, the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to provide for the erection of a building for the accommodation of Somerset county court, was read the third time by special order and passed.

On motion of Mr. Morris, the bill entitled, an act to authorise the mayor and city council of Baltimore to reduce the width of a part of Holland street, was read the third time and passed.

Mr. Morris from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore Snuff Mill Company, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.
