sidered, and on further motion of Mr. Montgomery, the following amendments were read and assented to:

After the word "that" in the 2nd line, of the resolution, insert the words "Governor and Council be requested to have."

In the same line, strike out the words "shall be."

After the word "annually" in the 7th line, insert the words "on the same day."

The question was then put, will the Senate assent to said resolution?

It was determined in the affirmative, and the resolution was returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Sappington presented the memorial of Henry Kemp of Frederick county, counter to the memorial of George Fouke and others, of Washington county.

Which was read and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message, which was read, and with the resolution, to wich it refers, referred to the committee on finance.

By the House of Delegates, February 21, 1833.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We return to you the resolution in favour of Meshaeh Browning, of Alleghany county, disserted from by your honorable body on yesterday, and respectfully request that you will reconsider the same, this is a case from its nature, extremely oppresive to the wlividual; that he should neither have the land he paid for, nor his money refunded, would be illiberal, it surely would not be sound policy for the state to adopt a doctrine that funds of individuals should be received into the treasury without a valuable consideration be given therefor, and the party claiming would not now he paid, or fairly reinstated, even if a new warrant for vacant land should be granted him, owing to all the vacant lands now in the county, being of very inconsiderble value, and remote from his residence, and where the original survey was situated; hence the propriety of his claim for the reimbursement of the money, is respectfully submitted for reconsideration.
