Mr. Morris from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act authorising the appointing of inspectors and wood corders, to regulate the cording of fire wood, brought by water to the city of Baltimore, which was read the first time.

Mr. Montgomery submitted the following message,

which was read and adopted:

SENATE CHAMBER.

February 23d, 1833.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We propose with the concurrence of your Honorable body to appoint a joint committee to consist of one member of this body, and such committee as you may appoint to visit the Maryland Hospital, to enable them to ascertain the repairs and furniture which said Hospital will require for the accommodation of its inmates.

We have appointed on the part of this house Mr. Montgomery, to join such gentlemen as shall be named

by your honorable body.

Mr. Pigman presented the petition of Alfred Lee, of Montgomery county, praying a final discharge without delay, under the insolvent laws of this state.

Which was read and referred to the committee on in-

solveney.

On motion of Mr. Mayer leave was granted to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act granting appeals from the court of chancery, and from the several county courts as courts of equity.

Ordered, that the committee on judicial proceedings,

prepare and report the same.

Mr. Mayer presented the memorial of John W. Thompson, praying for a release of the state's right to a lot of ground in the city of Baltimore.

Which was read and referred to the committee on ju-

dicial proceedings.

Mr. Mayer presented the petition of Horatio G. Jameson and others, praying an act to incorporate the Washington Medical College.

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Den-

nis and Montgomery.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the South Bal-
