It was read the third time, passed, and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Dennis from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to establish pilots, and regulate their fees, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Hughlett, Mr. Groome was appointed to fill the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of Mr. Reed in the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which was referred the petition of Horatio G. Jamison and others, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Washington Medical College of Baltimore,

Which was read foe first time.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the fellewing messages, which were read:

By the House of Delogates,

February 23rd, 1833.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have received and concur in your message proposing to appoint a joint committee to visit the Maryland Hospital to ascertain the repairs and furniture which said Hospital will require for the accommodation of its inmates, and have appointed on the part of this House, Messis. Wilson and Pratt to join the Gentlemen appointed by your Honorable Body.

We return you the bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act passed at December session 1831, prohibiting the use of gill nets in the Potomac and Patuxent rivers, repealing the same so far as it relates to certain portions of said rivers, and respectfully ask of your honorably body to reconsider the same, and pass it for the following reasons—
