Mr. Wootton from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise Catharine Bowie of Prince George's county, an infant under the age of twenty one years to convey to William D. Bowie certain real estate, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings to which was referred the bill entitled, an act limiting the time for the collection of the fees of attorneys, solicitors, clerks, registers, sherits and other officers of this state, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought not to pass. It was read the second, and by special order the third time, and the question was put, Shall the bill pass? It was determined in the negative, and the bill returned to the house of delegates

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Joseph Wood, former sheriff of Calvert

c:unty, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise the sale of certain real estate therein mentiqued, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second and by special order the third time and the question was put, Shall the bill pass?

It was determined in the negative, and the bill return-

ed to the house of delegates.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings to which was referred the resolution relative to the distribution of the index of the laws from the year 1826, to the year 1831, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.
