

Mr. Pigman from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of John Hamilton, George Hamilton, Jane Wrench, Thomas Wrench Sarah Boren and William C. Boren, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second, and by special order, the third time, and the question was put, "shall the bill pass?"

It was determined in the negative, and the bill returned to the house of delegates.
