Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Somerset and Worcester rail-road company,

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

Mr. Morris from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Oakland .Academy in Baltimore county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

Mr. Morris from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to make public a road therein mentioned, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Pigman the bill entitled, a further supplement to an act, entitled, an act to establish a Bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Cumberland Bank of Allegany, was read the third time by special order and passed.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to make a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to Havre de-Grace was read the third time and passed.

On motion of Mr. Wootton the bill entitled, a supplement to the actentitled, an act relating to free negroes and slaves, passed at December session 1831, chapter 323, was taken up for consideration, and whilst progressing in the third reading,

On motion of Mr. Page the following amendment was read:

In the 3rd line of the 2nd section, strike out the word "adjoining."

The question was then put, "will the senate assent to said amendment?"
