Mr. Wootton from the committee on internal improvement, to which was referred a bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from such point as the Somerset and Cumberland Turnpike Company, of Pennsylvania, shall fix upon at the Pennsylvania line to the public square in the town of Cumberland, or to intersect the United States Road commonly called the National Road, at such part as may be most convenient and practicable, reported favorably thereon.
