

Mr. Pigman from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to establish a bank, and incorporate a company under the name of the Washington County Bank, at the town of Williamsport, in Washington County.

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Alleghany Improving Company.

Which was read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the question was put, will the Senate agree to reconsider the bill entitled, an act to divorce Sarah Barrett, and her husband Patrick Barrett, of Baltimore county?

It was determined in the affirmative, and the bill ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Page, the question was put, "Will the Senate agree to reconsider the bill entitled, and act to repeal in part an act entitled, an act to prohibit the use of gill nets, in the Potomac and Patuxent rivers, during the period therein mentioned?"

It was determined in the affirmative, and the bill ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the bill entitled, an act relating to the manner of holding and transmitting the title to certain church property therein mentioned.

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion of Mr. Mayer the bill entitled, an act for the relief of John C. Helmkin, of the city of Baltimore, was read the third time, by special order, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Pigman, the following order was read and adopted:

Ordered, that the Senate will, for the remainder of the session, sit from nine o'clock, A. M. to three o'clock, P. M. and take a recess from three o'clock, to five o'clock, and then sit until 8 o'clock, P. M. if necessary for the dispatch of business; and the Senate will not agree to originate any bill or resolution of a general nature, at the present session, without the assent of two thirds of the Senate.
