"To pay to the said party the sum of twenty cents for each and every cord that said persons who try the appeal shall determine to be a deficiency or excess as the case may be."

On motion of Mr. Morris, the following amendments were read and assented to:

In the 23d and 24th lines of the 1st section fill the blank with "50 cents."

In the 26th line same section, after the word "deficiencies" insert the word "increase."

In the 27th line of the same section after the word "appeal" insert the word "appear."
