deducting expenses shall be paid over to such free negro or mulatto by the said justice or other person.

The bill was then read through and passed.

Mr. Dennis from the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Allegany county, to record a deed from Nicholas Bear and Catharine his wife to John Bear, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion ought not to pass.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, and the question was put, "shall the bill pass?"

And it was determined in the negative.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Fell's Point Savings Institution, of Baltimore.

Was read the third time as proposed to be amended, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Morris, the bill entitled, a further cupplement to the act entitled, an act authorising the appointment of inspectors and wood corders, and to regulate the cording of fire wood, brought by water to the city of Baltimore.

Was read the third time by special order, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Claude from the committee on internal improvement, to which was referred the resolution relative to the state map, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message:

By the House of Delegates,

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have received your message in answer to one from this house, in which we proposed to elect two additional directors on the part of the state in the Farmers Bank of Maryland, and accede thereto.
