Mr. Pigman presented the memorial of the Baltimore and Reisters town turnpike company, counter to the memorial of the Baltimore and Susquehanna rail road company; which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Claude from the committee on the library to which was referred the resolution relative to a catalogue of the books in the state library, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Pigman submitted the following message, which was read and adopted:

By the Senate,

March 7, 1833.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message proposing to elect one additional director for each shore for the Farmers Bank of Maryland, upon the terms and conditions of our message of March 6th, 1833, and concur therein. No person has been put in nomination by the senate in addition to the gentlemen named by you in your message of February 6th, 1833. We consent to go into the election this day, at 12 o'clock as proposed by you, and have appointed Messrs. Pigman and Morris to join the gentlemen named by your honorable body in your message of the 6th February 1833, to count the ballots.
