So it was determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Mayer the said bill was reconsid-

ered, and ordered to lie on the table.

The senate proceeded to ballot for two additional directors on the part of the state in the Farmers Bank of Maryland. The ballot box was prepared, and the bal-

lots deposited therein.

It was sealed up and delivered to Messrs. Pigman and Morris, who were appointed to meet the committee of the House of Delegates, to count the ballots, and report the result. They retired, and after some time, returned and reported that there were 68 votes, taken in all, of which Samuel Sprigg had 53 votes, for the Farmers Bank of Maryland, and Thomas Haywood had 53 votes, for the Branch Bank of the Farmers Bank of Maryland, at Easton, and that there were 10 blanks, and eight scattering votes.

Whereupon it was declared that for the Farmers Bank of Maryland, Samuel Sprigg is duly elected, and for the Branch Bank of the Farmers Bank of Maryland, at Easton, Thomas Haywood is duly elected directors on the part of the state, for and during the present year.
