Mr. Dennis then moved to make it the order of the day for to morrow the 8th inst.

And it was determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Montgomery from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the preservation of wild fowl in the waters of Swann creek, Spisutie Narrows, Rumney creek, Bush river and Gun Powder river in Harford county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Montgomery, the bill entitled, an act for building a bridge across the Little Falls of Gun Powder near Balden's mills, was reconsidered.

And on the further motion of Mr. Montgomery, the ques-

tion was put,

Will the senate recede from the amendments heretofore assented to except the first?

And it was determined in the affirmative.

The bill was then read and passed with the said first amendment, which was as follows:

In the 1st line of the 1st section strike out "and John Rutledge" and insert "Abraham Rutledge and William Nelson.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

## FRIDAY, March 8th, 1833.
