We beg leave to return to your honorable body, and respectfully submit to you the propriety of reconsidering the bill which you have rejected, entitled An act to repeal part of an act passed at December session 1824, chapter 167, authorising gates to be kept on the public roads in Queen Anne's county. This bill is of great importance, as will be seen by the petition submitted to this house, and for the want of the provisions it contains, much individual loss and embarrassment has been, and may be suffered, we therefore trust it may receive your favorable consideration.

Also the following resolutions.

A resolution in favor of James Frazier,

A resolution in favor of Jonathan Mason, alias Mason Grove of the State of Kentucky,

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionay claims.

Also a resolution relative to two accounts referred to in the Governor's Message of the 15th February last,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

The bill entitled, an act to authorize the repair of a bridge therein mentioned, was being read the third time.

When on motion of Mr. Morris, the following amendment was read and assented to:

In the 1st line of the 2d section strike out the name "George Ellicott" and insert the name "William Emmons."

The bill was then read through the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the establishment of a ferry from the lands of George Chichester in Montgomery county, over the river Potomac, nearly opposite the lower end of Black Walnut Island, was read the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.
