

TUESDAY, March 12th, 1833.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of William L. Marshall of the city of Baltimore, and

The bill entitled, an act relating to the importation of passengers, severally passed by the senate on yesterday, were sent, and

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the town commonly called and known by the name of East New Market in Dorchester county, also passed by the senate on yesterday, was returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Sappington from the committee to which was referred a bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Frederick and Baltimore counties, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message:

12th March, 1833.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We return you the resolution in favor of Ann Martin of Prince George's county, late the widow of Adam Wykall or Wycall, a soldier of the revolution. Believing this feeble old lady has strong claims upon the sympathy, the gratitude and the justice of the state, as any other widow of a revolutionary soldier. We respectfully solicit a reconsideration of the subject, and the assent of your honorable body to the resolution.
