Mr. Wootton from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief Edward W. Belt, former collector of Prince Georges county, reported that that committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment, which was read and assented to:

In the 12th line of the 1st section, insert the following words, "provided that nothing in this act shall be construed

to affect the estate of any deceased person "

Mr. Emory from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act declaring the power of the Governor in certain criminal cases passed at December session, 1795, chapter 82, reported favorably thereon.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to limit the time for entering and filing caveats to last wills and testaments and for other purposes, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, rejected and returned to the House of Delegates.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to define and enlarge the powers of courts of equity, being entitled to a third reading, was taken up for consideration and whilst progressing in the reading,

On motion of Mr. Mayer the following amendments

were read and assented to:

In the 14th line of the 5th section, after the word "par ties," macrt the words "or in the decision of the court."
