

A bill entitled, an act for incorporating the Govens-town Academy in Baltimore county.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Morris, Emory and Pigman.

A bill entitled, an act relating to a part of Caroline street in the city of Baltimore.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Mayer. Hughlett and Claude.

And returned the bill originated in the house of delegates which had heretofore been passed by the senate with certain amendments, entitled, a further supplement to an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Compauny, endorsed "the first and second amendments assented to, and the third amendment assented to with the proposed amendment."

Which proposed amendment was read the first time and was as follows:

"And provided also that before the treasurer shall give the endorsemet authorised by this act, he shall first have received such testimony as to him shall be satisfactory, that the state is made fully and absolutely secure from the payment of the interest on the said loan by a satisfactory policy of insurance."

The following message was received from his excellency Governor Thomas, by the hands of Thomas Culbreth, esquire, clerk of the council.

Which was read, and with the accompanying document referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.
