lina Ordinance.

Whereas, His Excellency the Governor, has transmitted to this General Assembly, the ordinance of the late convention of the people of South Carolina together with the proceedings of that body, whose object appears to be a resistence to the collection of duties, imposts, &c. upon foreign commodities, imported into that state, by nullifying the acts of congress, providing for the levying and collection assembly cannot be a special distance.
