

Also, returned the bill which originated in the senate entitled, an act granting appeals from the court of chancery, and from the several county courts, or courts of equity, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment."

The said amendment was read the first time and was as follows:

In the 13th line of the first section, strike out the words "the original bill," and insert, "an attested copy of the bill and proceedings."

On motion of Mr. Pigman leave was granted to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act concerning the justices of the Orphan's Court of Allegany County,

Ordered, that Messrs. Pigman, Hughlet and Mayer be a committee to prepare and report the same.

The Senate proceeded to the consideration of the order of the day, being the reports of the committee on internal improvement to which had been referred the memorial of the proprietors of the Susquehanna Canal, and the counter memorial of James Bosley relative to an increase of the chartered rights of the said proprietors, together with the bill reported by the minority of the committee.

The reports and documents were read and, after some debate,

On motion of Mr. Wootton the question was put,

"Shall the said reports, documents and bill be referred to the next General Assembly?"
