The senate met. Present the same members as in the forenoon.

The engrossed bills from No. 181 to No. 196 inclusive were read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates returned the said bills endorsed, "read and assented to,"

And delivered the engrossed bills of the House of delegates from No. 101, to No. 180 inclusive,

Which were read, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

His Excellency, Governor Thomas, appeared in the senate chamber,

On motion of Mr. Emory the following order was read and adopted:

Ordered, That Messrs. Emory and Mayer be a committee to inform the house of Delegates, that his Excellency Governor Thomas is now in the senate chamber ready to sign and seal such of the engrossed bills as are prepared for his signature.

Mr. Emory and Mr. Claude informed the senate that they had discharged the duty assigned them, and had been requested to say that the house of delegates would forthwith attend to witness the ceremony of signing and sealing the engrossed bills.

Accordingly the honorable speaker, and members of the house of delegates appeared in the senate chamber,

When his Excellency Gov. Thomas signed and sealed the following engrossed bills from No. 101 to No. 196 inclusive, in presence of both branches of the General Assembly, in conformity with the provisions of the constitution and form of government.

No. 101. A supplement to the act entitled, "An act for regulating and inspecting weights and measures of this State," passed at December session 1825, chapter 206.

102. A further supplement to an act to enlarge the bounds of Centreville, and for other purposes.
