

SATURDAY, March 16th, 1833

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution relative to the presentation of a sword to captain George W. Rogers, assented to by the senate on yesterday.

And the bill entitled, an act to regulate fences in Somerset county, passed by the senate on yesterday, were returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Page the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate the Steam Company of Princess Anne, passed at December session, 1815, chapter 52, was recommitted to the committee on internal improvement.

Mr. Page from said committee reported that in the opinion of the committee the said bill ought to pass with the following amendments, which were read and assented to:

After the word "institution," in the 4th line, of the 2nd section, insert the words, "for any other within the limits of Somerset county."

In the 8th line of the 2nd section, after the words "seven of" strike out the words "one hundred," and insert the word "forty."

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Dennis from the committee, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorize the levy court of Dorchester county, to levy a sum of money for the purpose of building a bridge across Slaughter creek, in said county, reported favorably thereon.

The bill entitled, an act to authorize the sale of a lot of ground in the town of Westminster, was read the third time as proposed to be amended, passed and returned to the house of delegates.
