

Which was read and assented to:

Add at the end of the bill the following section:

*“And be it enacted, That this act shall continue and be in force until the end of the year eighteen hundred and forty-five, and until the end of the session of assembly next succeeding said year.”*

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Pigman from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled an act to incorporate certain trustees to establish an academy or school house in or near Prince Frederick town, in Calvert county, to be known by the name and style of the Prince Frederick Town Academy, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Mayer the bill entitled, an act relating to appeals from the county courts was taken up for consideration and further amended as follows:

After the word “cause” in the first line of the first section, insert “in any county court of any judicial district of this state except the fourth judicial district.”

*“And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the court of appeals to file its opinion on each point, of all bills of exceptions brought before it in any cause hereafter determined by said court, and on all demurrers, general or special, or to evidence; and in all other cases argued orally or in writing before said court.”*

The question was then put, “Shall the bill be engrossed for a third reading?”

And it was determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Claude from the committee on pensions to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to provide for the purchase of land and the erection thereon of an Alms House in Allegany county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment:
