The bill entitled, an act to provide for the repairs of the public roads in Calvert county.

Was read the third time as proposed to be amended, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Sappington, the bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to provide for the making the several turnpike roads, and for the extension of the charter of the several banks therein mentioned, passed at December session 1827, chapter 42, was being read the third time by special order, when

On motion of Mr. Pigman the following amendment was read and assented to:

Strike out the words "and authority," in the 15th line of the 1st section, and insert the words with "interest."

On motion of Mr. Sappington the following amendments were read and assented to:

16th and 17th lines strike out the words "whether such person or persons had been travelling upon the said turnpike road or not."

At the end of the bill add:

"And be it enacted, That this law and every matter and thing therein contained, shall be at all times subject to repeal or amendment by the General Assembly."

The bill was then read through, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution in favor of Catharine Whitelock, of Cecil county.

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make so much of the north western road, as may pass through Allegany county.

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

A bill entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of lime inspectors for the city of Baltimore and prescribing their duties.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs Morris, Mayer and Sappington.
