Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have considered the amendments of your honourable body, to the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, an act relating to free negroes and slaves, passed at December session 1831, chapter 323, and respectfully ask that you will reconsider the same, and recede therefrom and strike out the second section of the bill.

We believe that the said section is in violation of the second section of the fourth article of the constitution of the United States.

Also, a resolution in favour of Joseph Williams of the city of Annapolis; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also the following bills:

A bill, entitled, an act to compel the presidents and managers of the several turnpike road companies incorporated by an act, entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes, passed January 12th, 1805, chapter 51, to keep their respective roads in repair.

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

A bill, entitled, an act to secure to mechanics and others payment for labour done and materials furnished in the erection of buildings, and machinery or either of them within this state; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill, entitled, an act to continue in force the acts which
