

gany county, or to any college, or to any county school, the crop and produce of the land in the hands of the person whose lands produced the same, or in the hands of the tenant, and provisions necessary for the use and consumption of the person to whom the same shall belong and his family for the year, and plantation utensils, the working tools of mechanics and manufacturers actually and constantly employed in their respective occupations, wearing apparel, goods, wares and merchandise, and all home made manufactures, in the hands of manufacturers, all ready money, all grain and tobacco, shall not be assessed and valued under this act."

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.
