Mr. Dennis from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution relative to newspapers, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to the House of Delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to call a convention to revise the constitution of the state of Maryland, was being read the second time, when

On motion of Mr. Mayer the following amendment was read and assented to:

In the 3d line of the 7th section, after the word 'convention,' insert the words 'at the city of Annapolis.'

The bill was then read through, when

On motion of Mr. Dennis it was ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act passed November session 1799, chapter 68, concerning persons holding offices of profit and trust under the United States Government, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr Morris from the committee on internal improvement, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the continuation of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road to Harper's Ferry, and for other purposes, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time,

On motion of Mr. Morris, the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Somerset and Worcester Rail Road Company, was taken up for consideration, and whilst progressing in the third reading,

On motion of Mr. Morris the following amendment was read and assented to:
