

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Claude from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of James B. Dixon, former sheriff of Calvert county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments:

Which were read and assented to.

After the word "them," in the 7th line, 2nd section, insert "which shall contain the specific items charged."

At the end of the bill insert the following provisos:

Provided, that if any person against whom there is a claim by said Dixon, aforesaid, shall make affidavit before any justice of the peace of said county that he or she believes the same to be unjust, or that the same had been paid at any previous time, it shall forever bar such claim.

And provided, That nothing in this act shall be construed to affect the estate of any deceased person.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Claude the bill entitled, an act to repeal in part, an act entitled, an act to prohibit the use of gill nets in the Potomac River and Patuxant River during the period therein mentioned.

Was taken up for consideration, and on the further motion of Mr. Claude, the following amendment was read and assented to:

Strike out from the words "below the" in the 5th line to the end of the bill and insert the words "mouth of Hall's Creek."

The bill was then read, and the question put, "Shall the bill pass."

And it was determined in the affirmative and the bill returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Claude from the committee on internal improvement to which was referred the bill entitled, an act supplemental to an act to declare and ascertain the rights of citizens of this state to private roads or ways, reported favorably thereon.
