time while paying this light tax, to place by a gradual and estry operation fences along the highways instead of gates, and that after giving full warning to the parties holding them, and full time to exercise their option, whether they will choose to make fences or pay a tax, after a future day not yet arrived, which may be something like an equivalent to the community for the nuisance which they think proper to retain on the public highway. These nuisances are not only very inconvenient but they frequently occasion the loss of life and property. We therefore regard the existing law as salutary, and calculated to place the people of the county on something like equal terms in society. man for his particular convenience, be permitted to put an inconvenient obstruction on the public highway, which is a nuisance to an hundred others, surely it is but fair and right that he should make some trifling amends to the community for the enjoyment of such a privilege. The existing and contemplated future tax under the law which you proposè to repeal, we do not regard as more than an adequate indemnity to the community at large for the inconvenience sustained: And therefore respectfully decline the passage of the bill.
