

On motion of Mr. Morris the bill entitled, an act to divorce Sarah Barrett from her husband Patrick Barret of Baltimore county, was taken up for consideration.

On the further motion of Mr. Morris the amendments heretofore assented to by the senate, were reconsidered, and the question put,

“Will the senate assent to said amendment?”

And it was determined in the affirmative:

The bill was then read as proposed to be amended, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Emory from the committee on pensions reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief sundry poor persons, in the several counties therein mentioned, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Hughlett from the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims to which was referred the resolution in favor of Catherine Whitelock reported favorably thereon:

On motion of Mr. Pigman,

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to reduce into one, the several acts of assembly respecting elections and to regulate said elections, was taken up for consideration, and the amendments heretofore reported to-day were read and assented to.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, rejected and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Dennis from the committee on finance to which was referred the resolution relative to certain accounts referred to in the Governor's message of the 15th of February last, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time assented to and returned to the House of Delegates.
