FRIDAY, March 22, 1833.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yester-day The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Dennis from the committee, to which was referred the resolutions, relative to the union of the Eastern Shore, of the state with Delaware, reported that the committee had had said resolutions under consideration, and were of opinion they ought to be assented to, with the following amendments, which were read and assented to:

Strike out all that part of the first resolution, after the word "proposition," in the tenth line thereof, and substitute therefor, the following words, viz: "in order that the next legislature may be apprized of their views and wishes on this subject."

Strike out the second resolution.

Strike out in 2nd line. 31 resolution, the words "the resolution," and insert "this resolution."

The resolutions were read the second, and by special order the third time, and the question was put, "Shall the resolutions be assented to?"
