

A bill entitled, an act to subject stocks and funded property to attachment and execution for debt.

A bill entitled, a supplement to the act passed at December session 1810, chapter 34, relating to devises and legacies.

Also the following bills which originated in the senate, severally endorsed "will not pass."

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to define and enlarge the powers of courts of equity.

A bill entitled, an act relating to appeals from county courts.

A bill entitled, an act for the relief of Robert H. Hays of Cecil county.

A bill entitled, an act for the relief of William L. Marshall of the city of Baltimore.

On motion of Mr. Sappington the resolution submitted on the 20th inst. last requesting the executive to appoint a person to prepare and report some provisions in relation to special legislation, was taken up for consideration.

On motion of Mr. Emory, the following amendment was read and dissented from.

Strike out of the resolution the words "one person" and insert the words "the two gentlemen already appointed to codify the laws."

The resolution was then read through, and the question was put,

"Shall the resolution be engrossed for a third reading?"

It was determined in the affirmative.

It was accordingly engrossed,

And on motion of Mr. Sappington, read the third time and the question was put,

"Shall the resolution be assented to?"

And it was determined in the negative.

Mr. Dennis from the committee on finance to which was referred the resolution in favor of the president and visitors of the Maryland Hospital, reported favorably thereon.
