

Strike out all the bill after the word "supplement" in the 8th line and insert,

"Provided however, That this act shall not be deemed to extend to any proceeding now pending, and provided also, that the court be satisfied that the road prayed for be not a road to a stone quarry the working of which will injure or endanger any dwelling house, tavern house or out-house attached thereto; and provided further, that in granting the said road it shall be lawful for the court to prescribe a period and terms, when and upon which the said road shall cease and may be shut up or when it shall be necessary for the continuance of said road to have the grant for the same at the discretion of the court renewed."

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hughlett from the committee to which was referred the resolution in favor of John Marshall, reported favorably thereon,

It was read the second and by special order, the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Dennis, the resolution in favor of Meshack Browning was reconsidered,

And on the further motion of Mr. Dennis the question was put,

"Will the senate assent to said resolution."

It was determined in the negative, and the resolution returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Dennis from the committee on finance to which was referred the resolution relative to the armories, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings to which was referred the resolution in favor of Alexander Shaffer, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought not to pass.
